Berkeley Pit Viewing Stand Ribbon Cutting and Grand Opening Held July 16th

Approximately 300 people attended the official ribbon cutting ceremony on Thursday, July 16. Margie Krsul served as the emcee for the event. Herb Leuprecht, President of Envision Butte, Inc., spoke of the history of this project. It started in July of 2006 and three years later we have a beautiful park setting with a gazebo; restrooms; Norm DeNeal's signature garden with an Irish Design featuring a large Celtic Knot. To enhance the area, period lighting was installed with beautiful "Welcome to Butte" banners and hanging flower baskets. Herb remarked that in just sixty-seven tourist days of 2009 approximately 12,000 tourists have visited the Berkeley Pit.






Reception Held for New Superintendent of Schools
